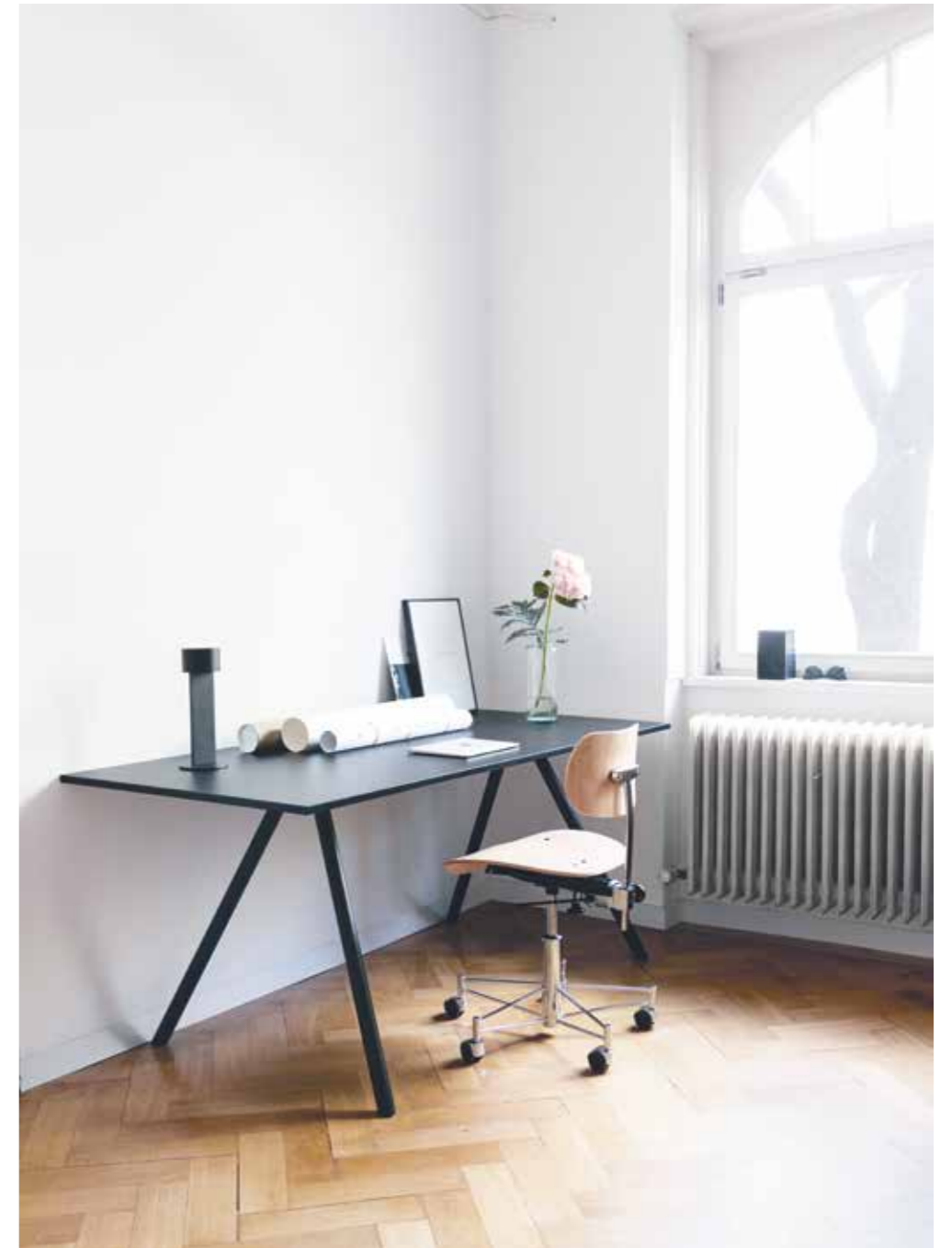

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What does it take to be timeless? Throughout our near-two centuries-long history, consistency—of production, aesthetics, and above all, quality—has been both our motivation and our objective. Across each decade's ebbs and flows, we'd like to think it's consistency that has allowed us to forge alliances with the world's foremost architects, and that has earned our furniture its status among modern classics. While our story evolves, our impetus remains the same: to produce chairs of high-calibre comfort and understated elegance for a lifetime. A reflection on the components that enable us to do so follows.

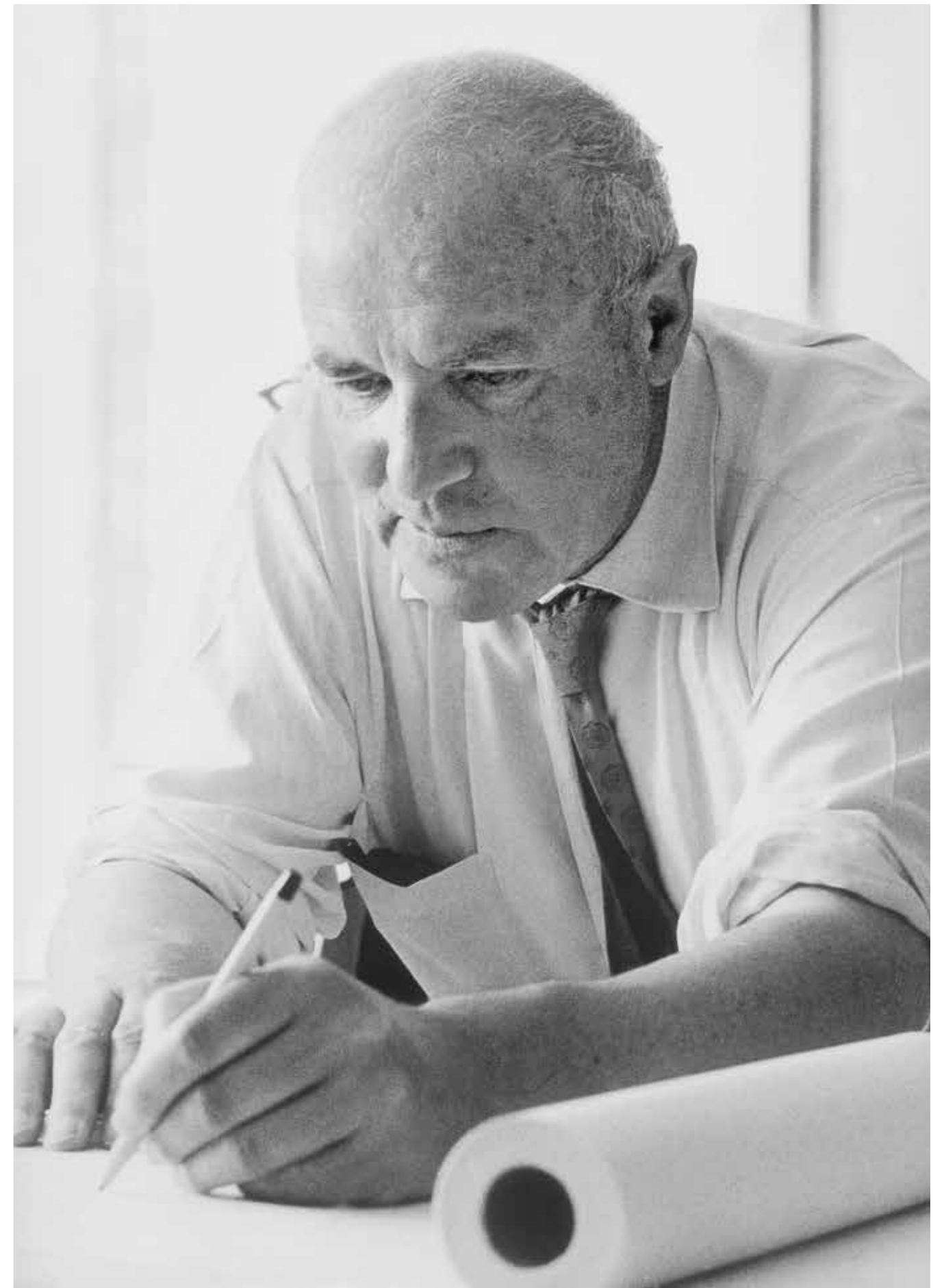
Long-standing Tradition

Baden-Württemberg, 1831. The carpentry workshop Schreinerei Spieth was founded amidst the rich craft heritage of the Medieval town of Esslingen on the Neckar River. In 1912, Mr. Wilde joined the business, and the newly-formed Wilde + Spieth moved into roller shutter construction: a fortuitous undertaking, as the quality of the shutters gained the attention of pioneering German architect Egon Eiermann, who

incorporated them into his domestic constructions and renovations. A flourishing partnership ensued, and in 1948, Eiermann's need for durable, affordable furniture for his social housing construction led him to propose a joint venture in furniture production. The moment was a pivotal one in the history of Wilde + Spieth, giving us a clarity of purpose that has since remained steadfast.

Trusted Partnership

Founded on shared values and complementary strengths, our partnership with Egon Eiermann was driven by a mutual appreciation for functional aesthetics, uncompromising precision and a dedication to perfectionism. The visionary architect provided the design ingenuity; we offered our expertise in craft and finely-tuned production techniques. The result, forged over a two-year-long process of experimentation in material and form, marked a breakthrough in the history of chair design: a seat and back made from pressed beech plywood and contoured to the human form for optimal sitting comfort.



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The seats of the SE 68 chair consist of 9 layers of beech veneer glued together and then pressed into shape. For every tree we use for our furniture, a new tree is planted. We're resolute in our belief that our world and our environment is a shared responsibility.

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The development was met with such acclaim that it formed the base of 30 distinct designs over the following two decades. Each variation caters to specific requirements—from stack- and foldability to swivel functionality and bar stools—yet was unmistakably emblematic of the heightened function and pure form underpinning the collaboration that created it.

Meticulous Craftsmanship

Reverence for the natural properties of our materials has always guided our production methods. In the 1950s, plywood was rarely used in the German market, so we started to work with it from scratch, creating our chair moulds and prototypes—along with the technology required to produce them—ourselves. Today, the niche scale of our production has led us to entrust leading local specialists with our manufacturing, allowing us the flexibility to fulfil custom colour, coating, and functionality requests while ensuring the uncompromising quality of the ‘Made in Germany’ seal remains true. Environmental responsibility is integral to every step

of our process: durability is ingrained in each chair’s design, and further ensured by our commitment to first-grade materials. For every tree that becomes a Wilde + Spieth chair, another is planted—meaning that the forest from which we source our wood has remained the same size ever since 1870.

Designed to Endure

Simplicity, balance, universality: the priorities shared by Wilde + Spieth and Egon Eiermann have resulted in silhouettes and materials that seamlessly adapt to their surroundings as well today as they did in the 1950s. Today, we’re proud to focus on essentials that have stood the test of time: a refined range of icons that bridge the modern with the contemporary. Free of extraneous elements, the reduced forms of the chairs—and two tables—in our Classic Collection serve as ideal canvases for subtle updates that reflect present aesthetic preferences. A wide range of bespoke finish options, from matte powder-coated steel to natural wood finishes, enable the ongoing relevance of a classic within the zeitgeist, time and time again.

1 SE 68 Multipurpose Chair

Egon Eiermann, 1951
Until today Eiermann's SE 68 is unique in its minimalist design and its seating comfort. A tubular steel frame in conjunction with an "organically" shaped seat and backrest made of moulded wood – the SE 68 was the earliest model in Germany in this combination of materials. To give furniture a "human dimension", that was Egon Eiermann's goal – and anyone who has ever sat on his SE 68 knows that hardly anyone lived up to this aim as much as the self-confessed perfectionist himself.

3 SB 68 Bar Chair

In their typical simplicity, the four-legged stools impress both with their stability and their perfect design. The SB 68 provides an alternative to the SB 38 – an elegant bar stool with backrest which is very comfortable.

2 SE 68 SU Stackable Chair

The multi purpose stacking chair. The SE 42 is a three-legged wooden chair which stands out from the masses thanks to its distinctive lines and exclusive workmanship.

We offer armrests for added comfort. The armrests are stained, lacquered, or natural wood according to the chair.




























Wood Veneers

1 Custom Colours

In addition to our standard colours, special colours for wooden parts and frames are possible for an additional charge. Give us a RAL colour for this or provide us with a stain sample of the respective wood type. Wilde + Spieth works environmentally friendly only with water-based stains. Wood is a natural product, so there may be colour deviations.

2 Fabrics

You have the option of choosing between two upholstery options: screw-on cushions for the seat and screw-on cushions for the seat and back

We recommend the fabrics from Rohi or Camira as upholstery fabrics. You will find a suitable selection of colours on page 49. It is also possible to choose from the entire range of Rohi, Camira and other manufacturers of your choice. Price on request.

3 Lacquered Colours

White chairs and stools are only available with a lacquered finish. Lacquer prevents the wooden parts from yellowing naturally over time and guarantees a long-term, consistent colour impression. The white lacquered version with a visible wood structure is now also available.

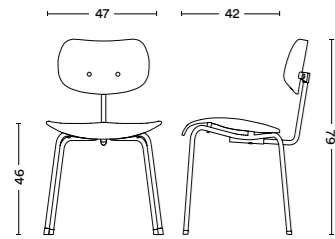
4 Frame Colours

Steel frames are available in chrome, matt black and satin finish. Black frames are smoothly powder-coated.

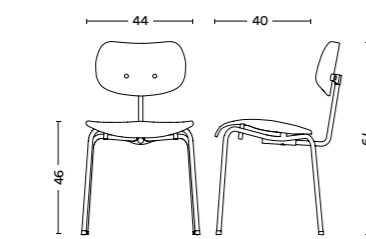
5 Glides and Casters

Orders

Orders are scheduled for processing as soon as all necessary details, e.g. materials and dimensions, are agreed upon. Posted fabric and colour samples have to arrive in time. Adjustments to already placed orders are possible, given proper notification on our side. Additional costs caused have to be charged to your order.

Terms of Delivery

Terms of delivery given in the Wilde + Spieth confirmation of order are to be understood as approximate dates EXW. Delivery ex works, Germany. Warranty within our general terms of delivery and payment.

Casters

Casters are blocked according to load. For soft floors (e.g. carpets) you require hard casters and for hard floors soft casters (with a lighter middle ring) to suit DIN 4551. Casters for hard floors are standard.

Open-Cell Stain

With wooden parts staining is possible for an additional charge. Wilde + Spieth operates with environmentally suitable water-based stains. Information according to RAL-chart of a stained sample of the ordered wood is necessary. Wood is a natural product therefore discolouring may occur. Our stain is resistant to cleaning agents.

Posted Fabric

We upholster with your fabric. Please send us the material free of charge. In case the material does not arrive in time, the confirmed delivery date might have to be postponed. The stated material supply is to be understood without addition due to rapport. Wilde + Spieth is not to be held accountable for the quality and processing. Please make sure the fabric is at least 130 cm wide, excluding the weaving edges. Please send a sufficiently large piece of cloth to ensure trial upholstery in regards to rapport size and direction.

Please make sure that the fabric without selvage is at least 130 cm wide.

Leather

Leather is a natural product. Discolouring, wrinkling and structural irregularities may occur and present no deterioration of quality thus are not subject to reclamation.

We offer custom made models, such as special sizes or styles or special types of wood. We reserve the rights of changed constructions and prices.
